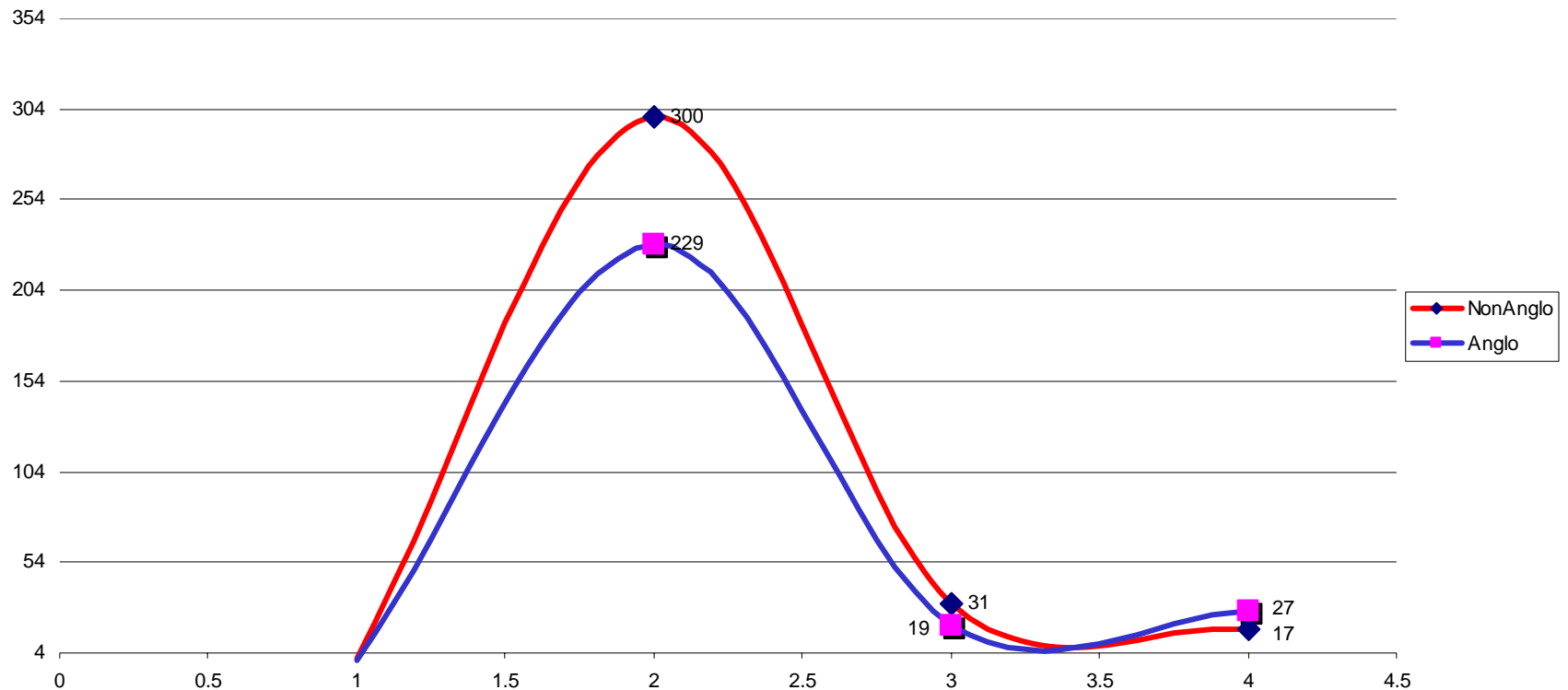

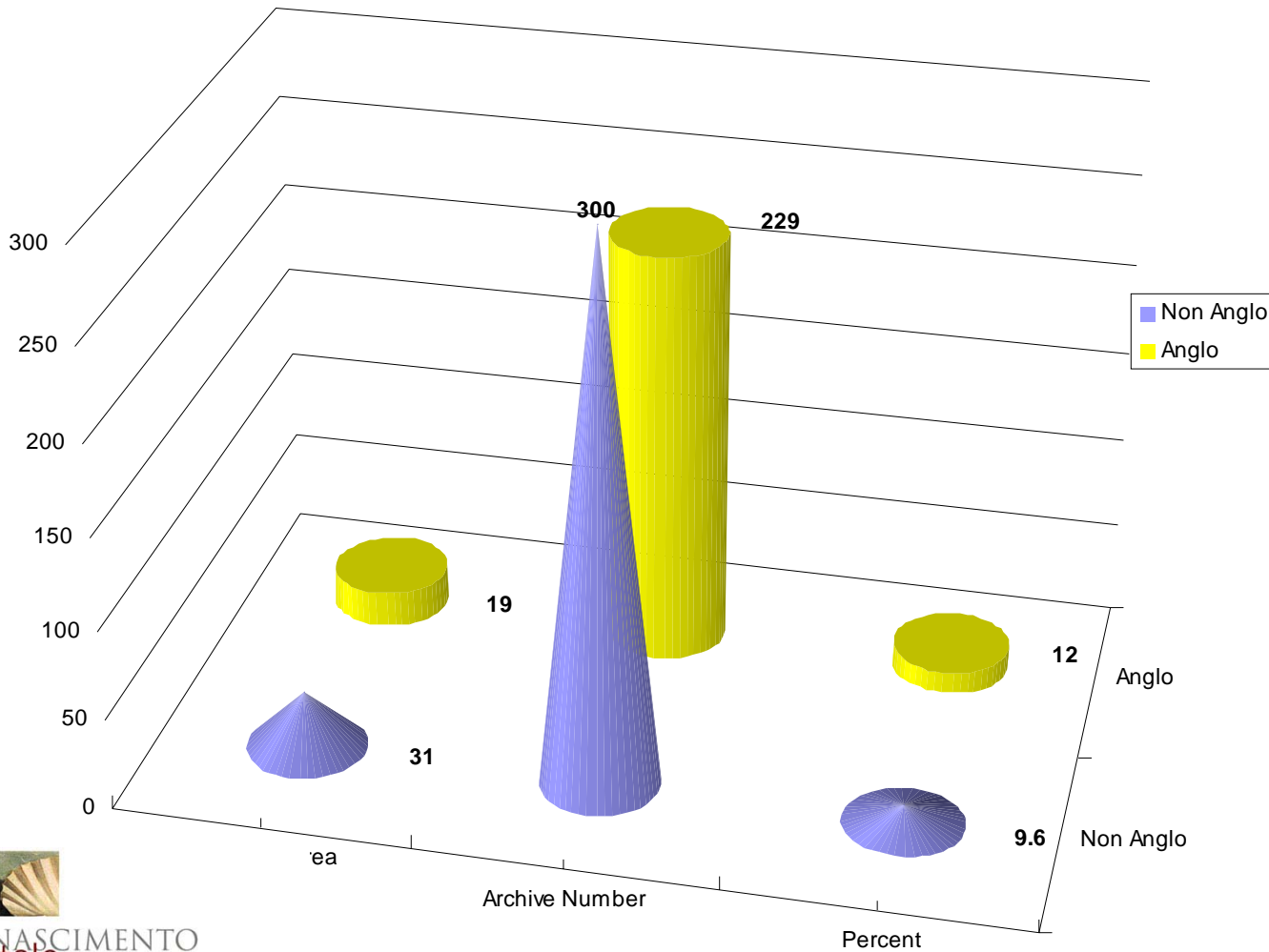

# Data providers of the OAI (1): Proportion x Linguistic Area

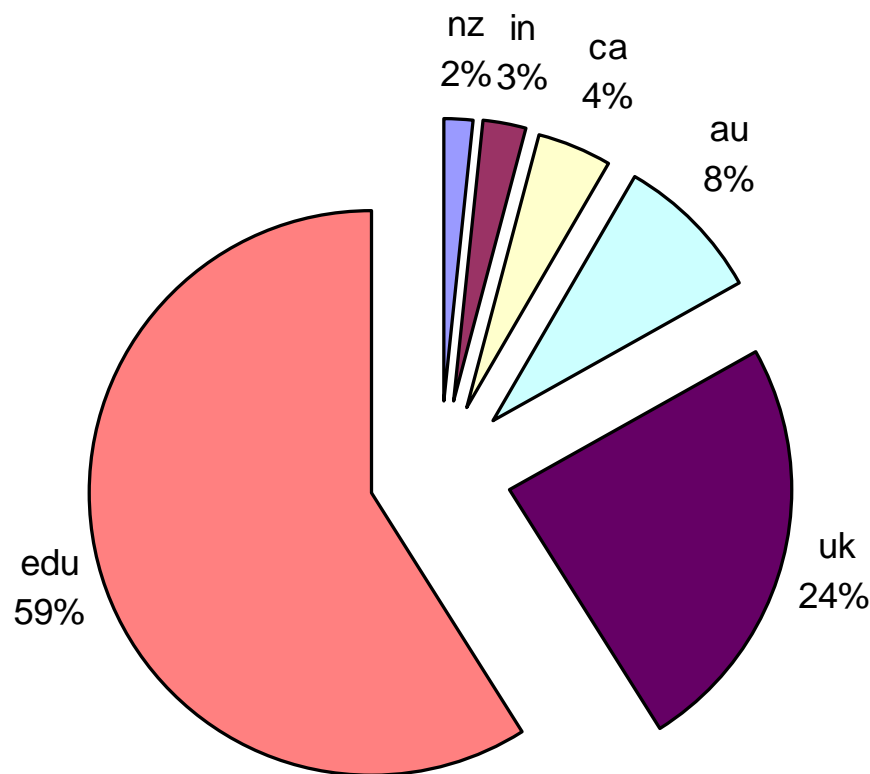

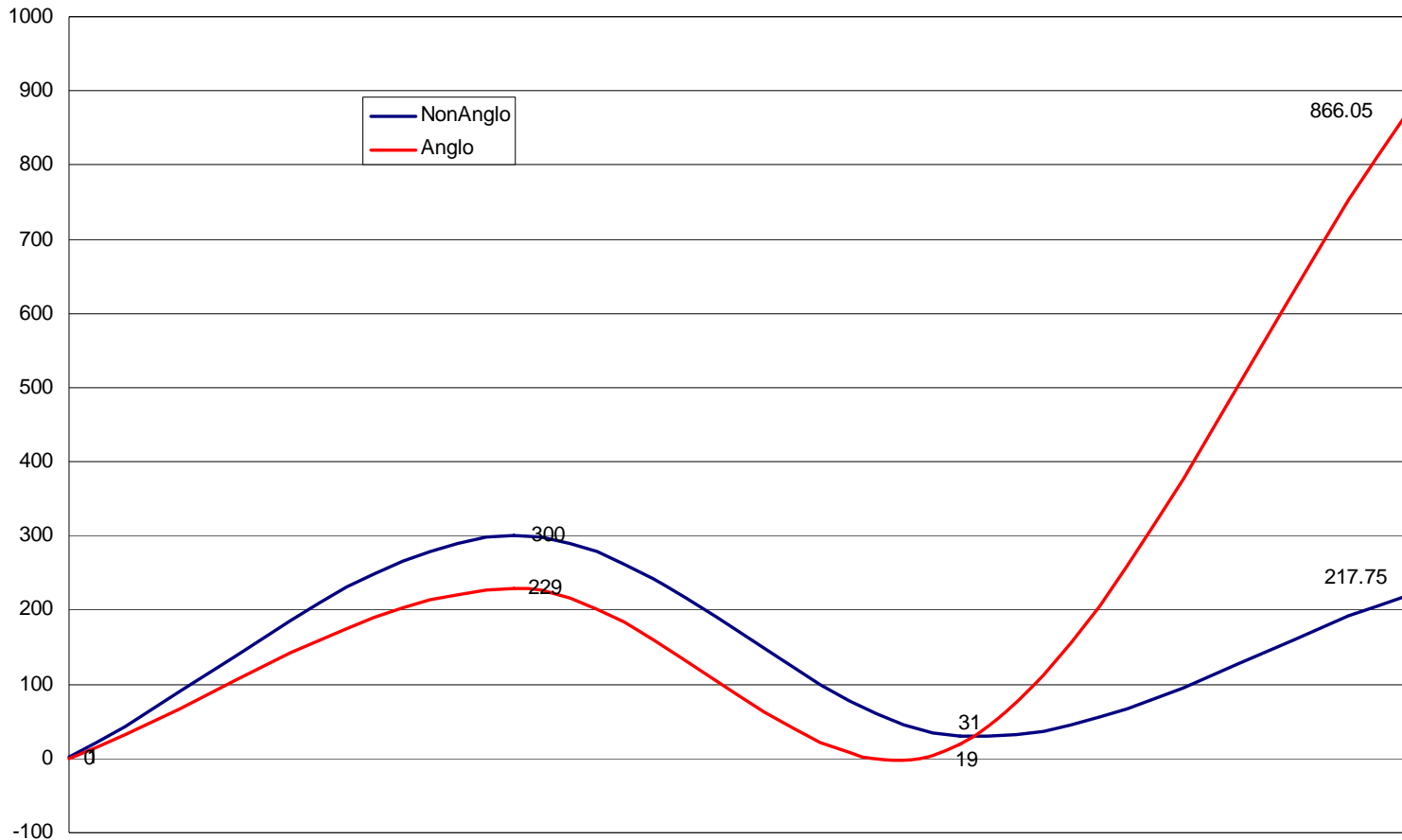

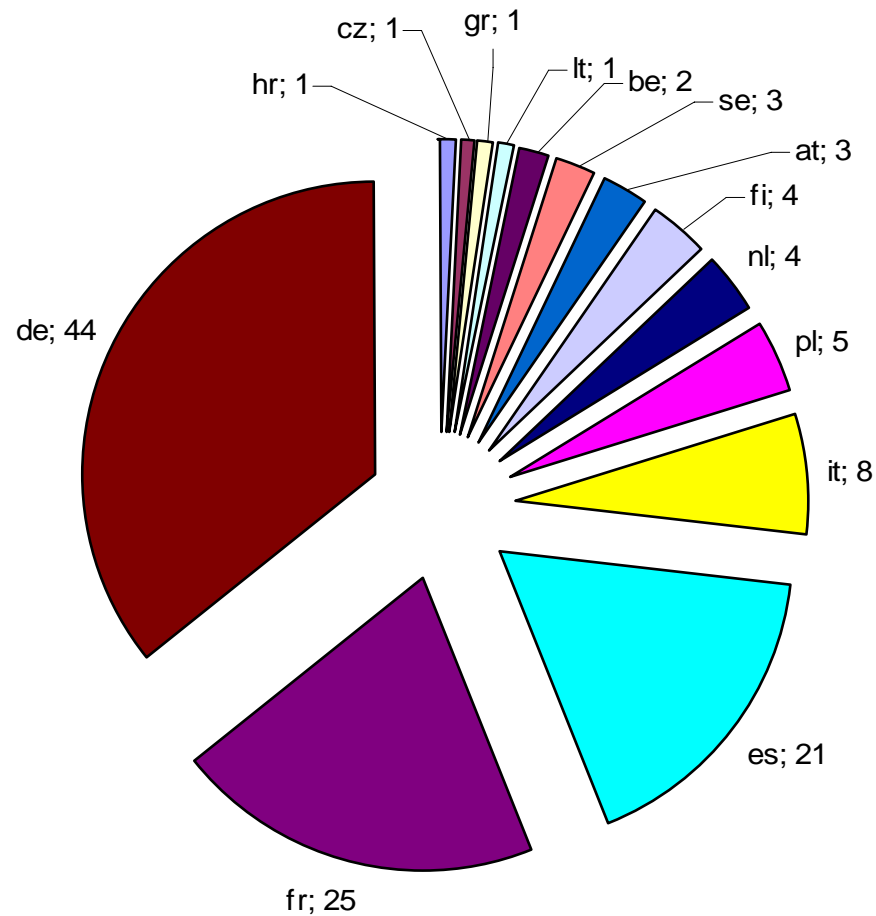
# Data providers of the OAI (2): Proportion within Anglophone Area



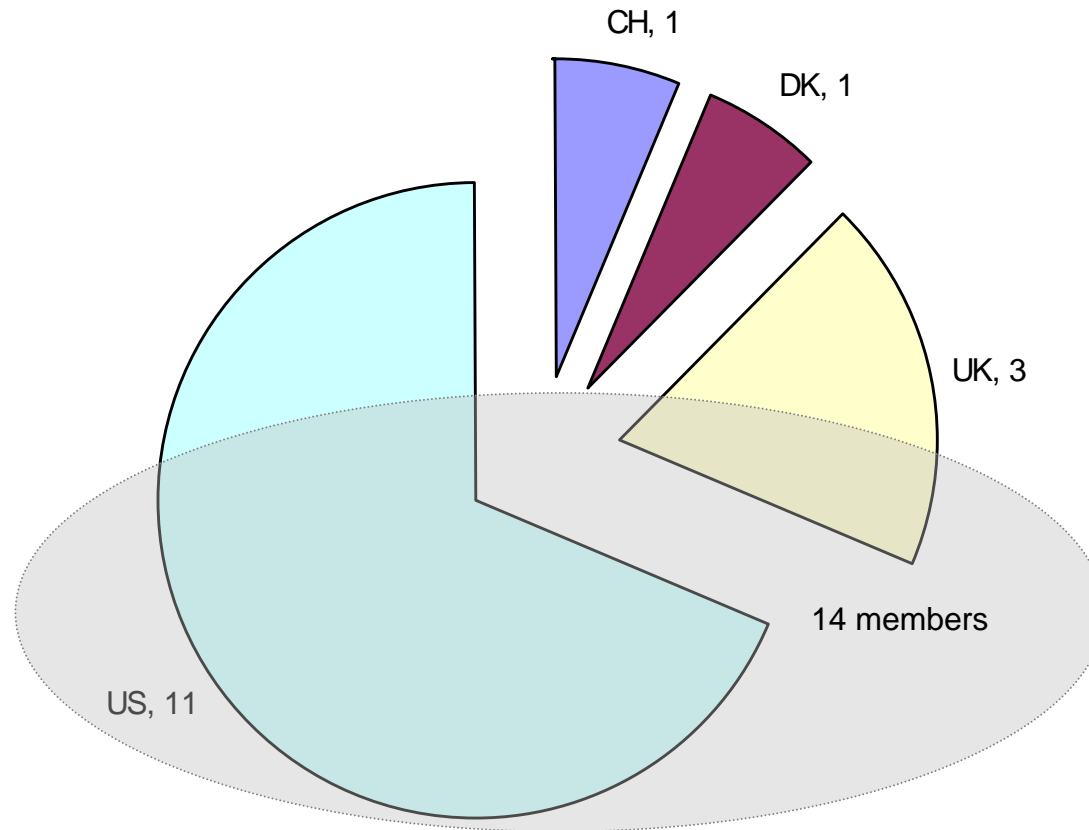
# Data growth projection of the OAI (3):

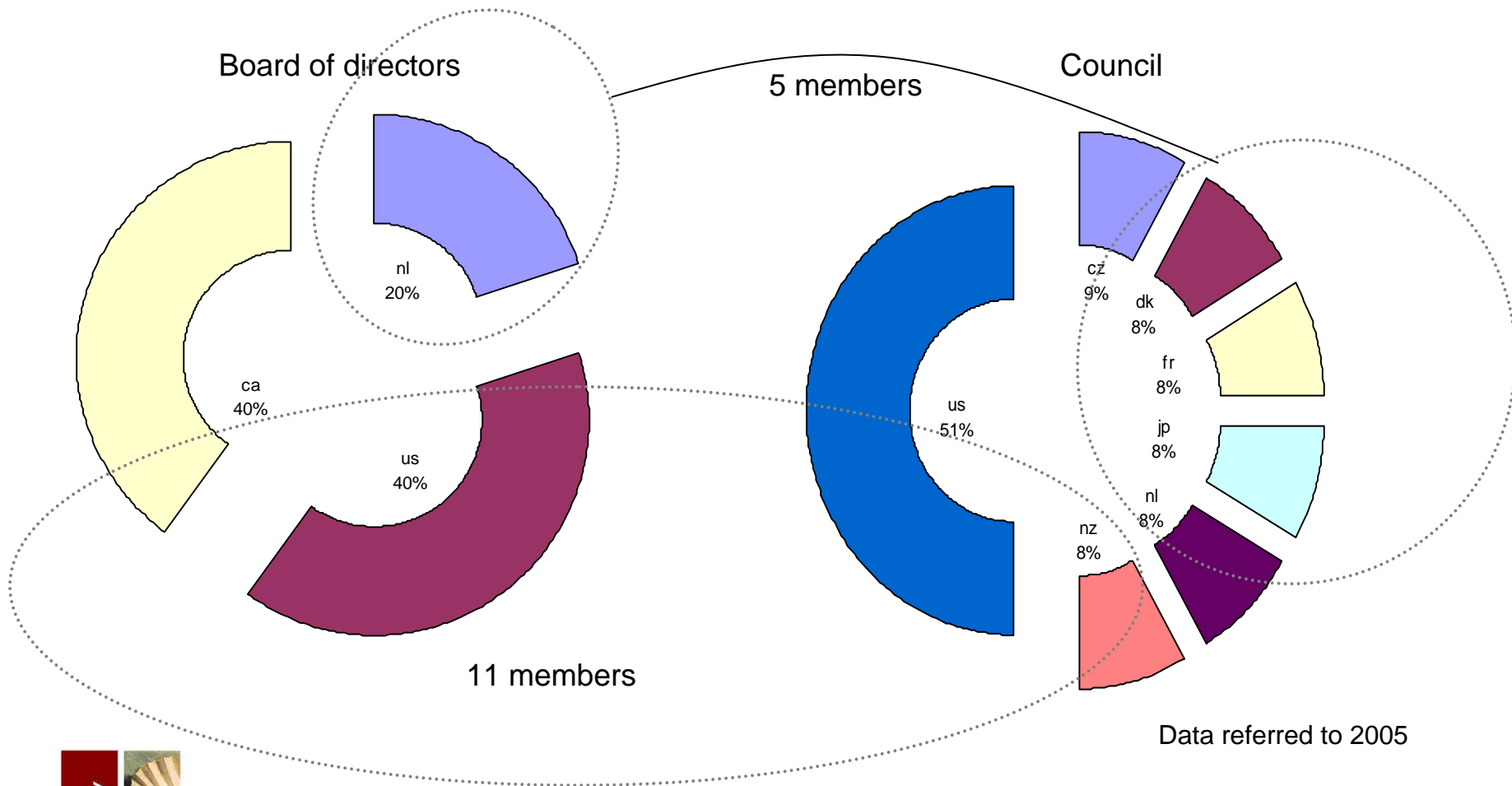

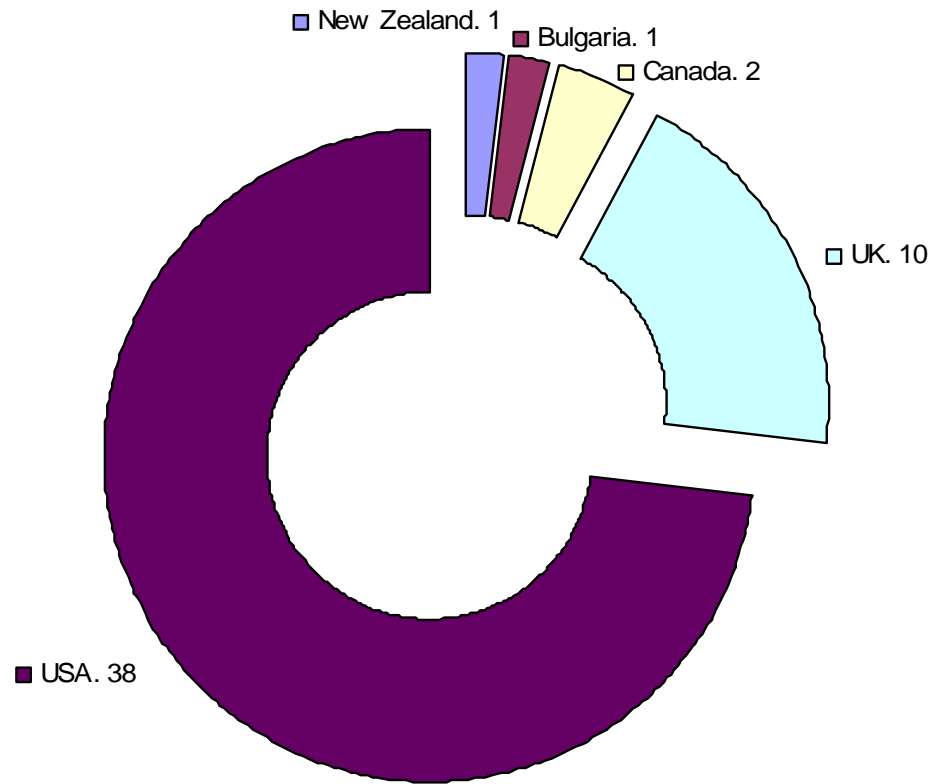

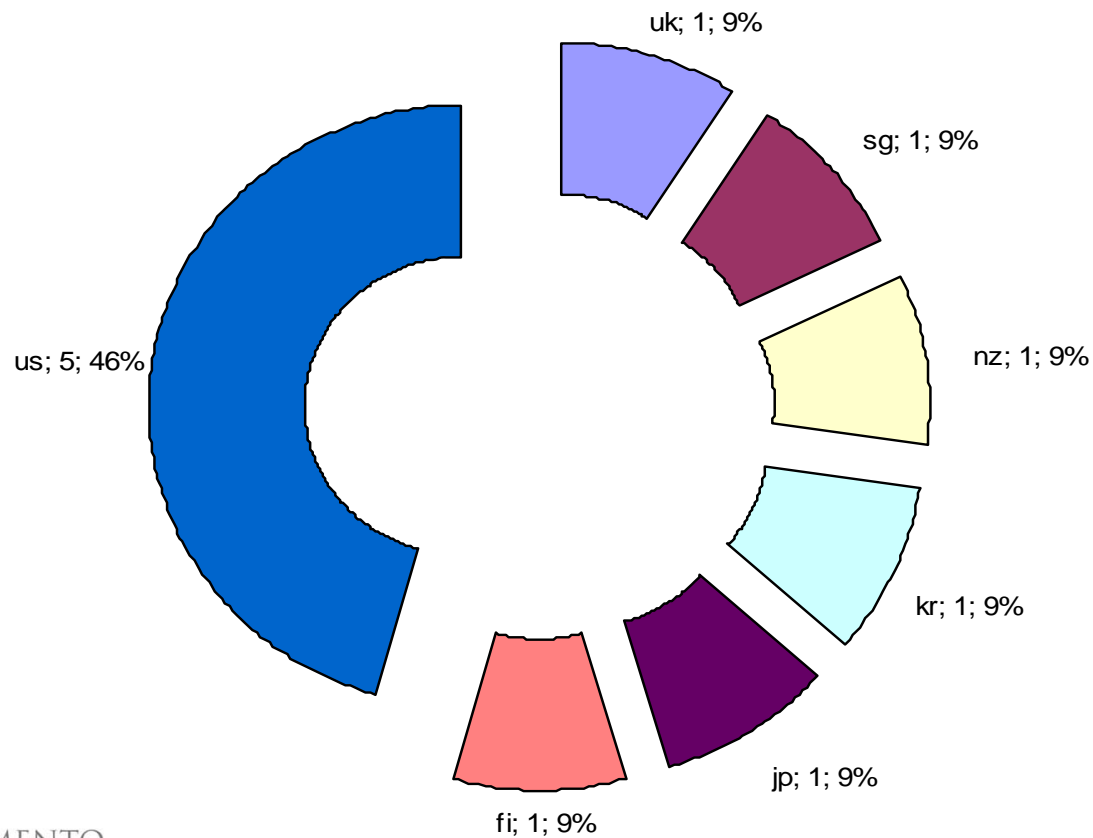

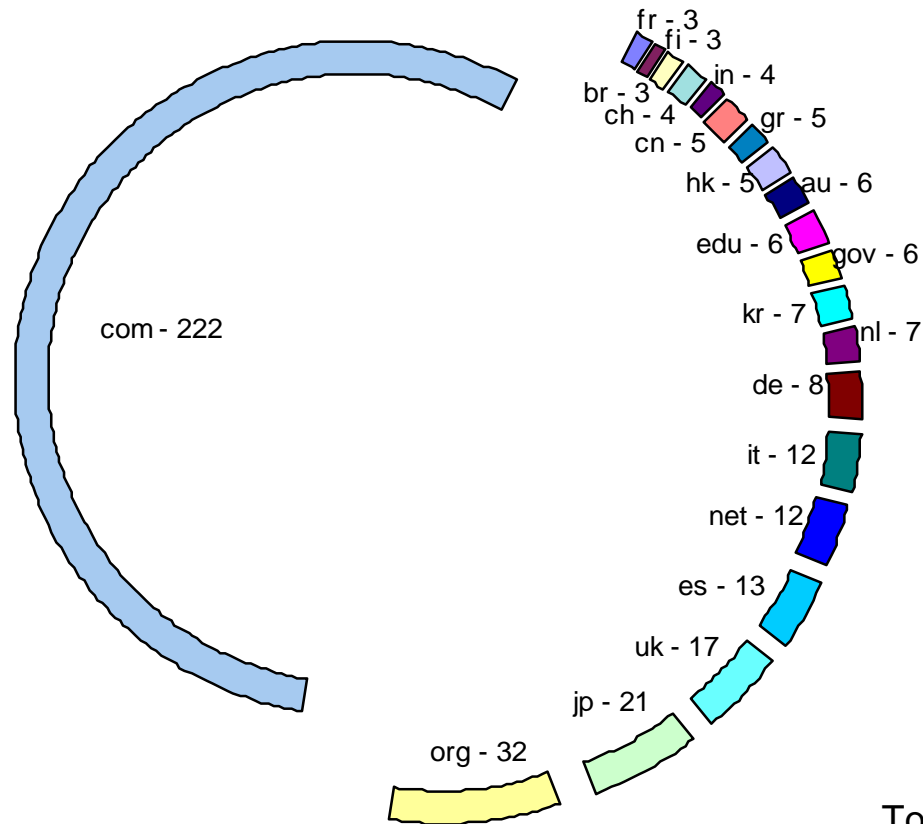

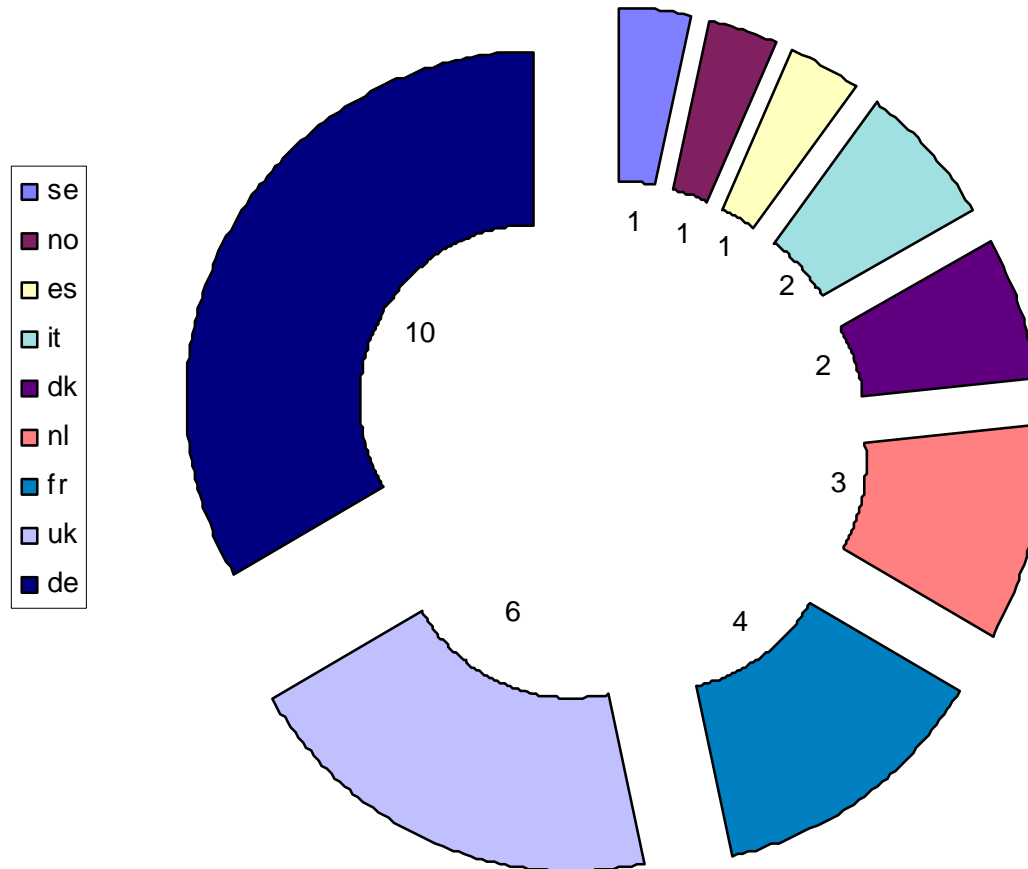

# W3C Registered Members per domain suffixes

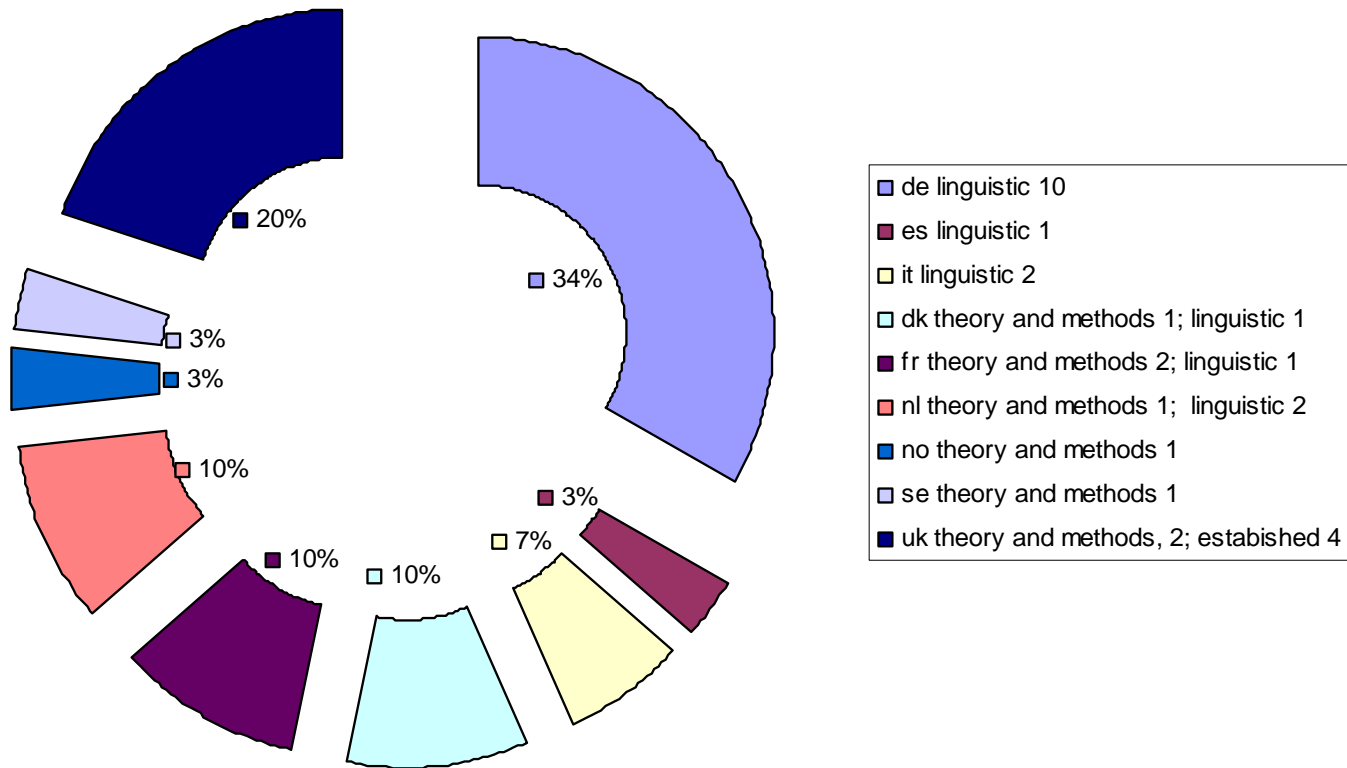

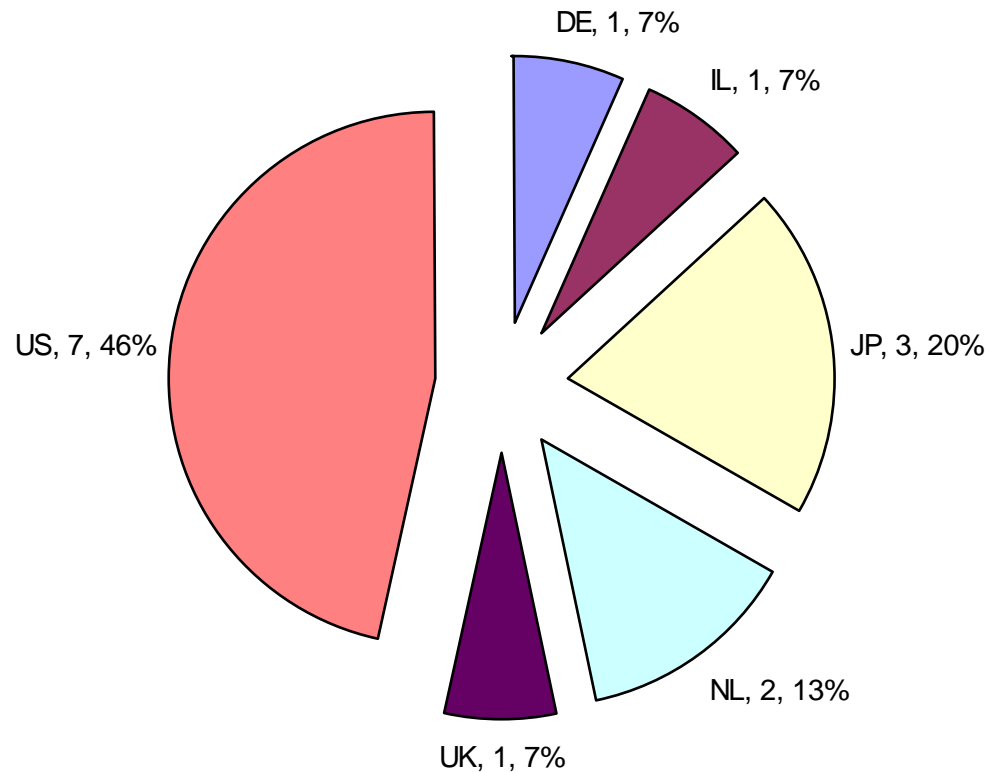
# Overview of the existing courses in C & H in the EU



# Type of courses in C & H

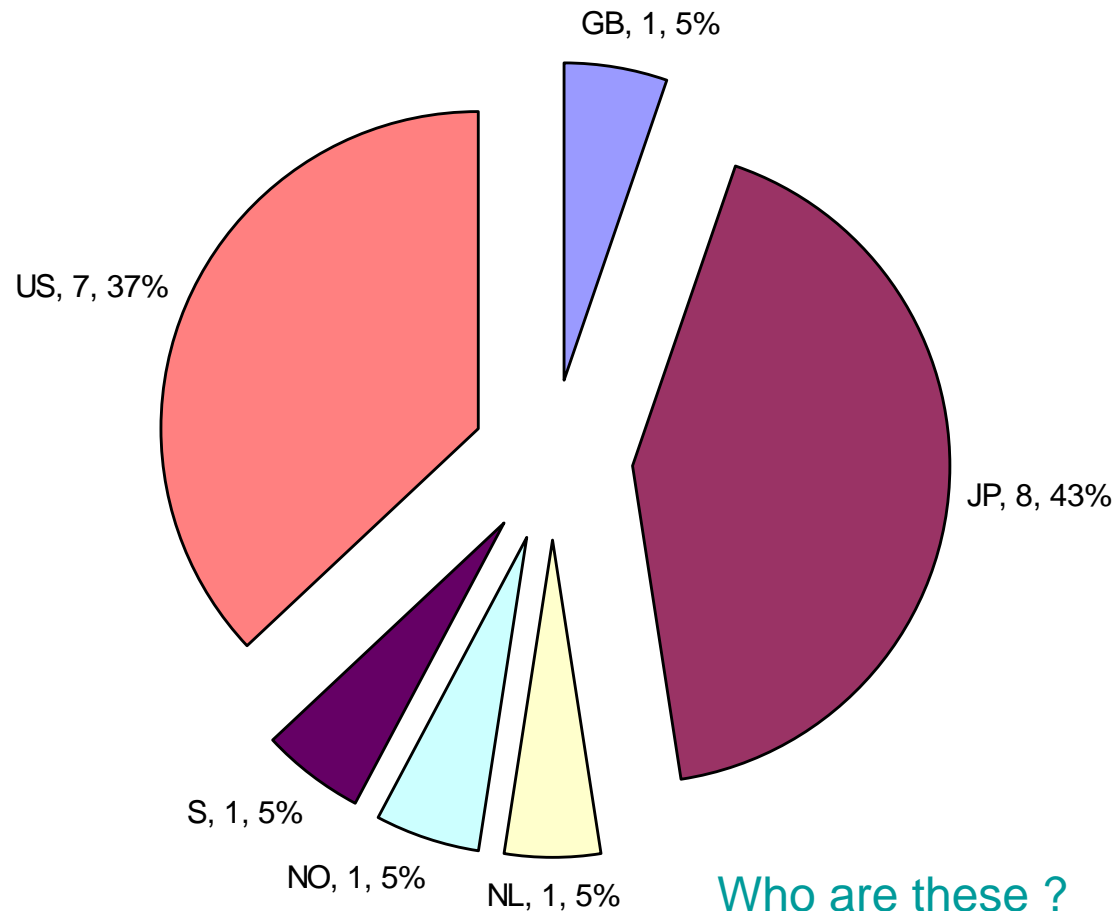

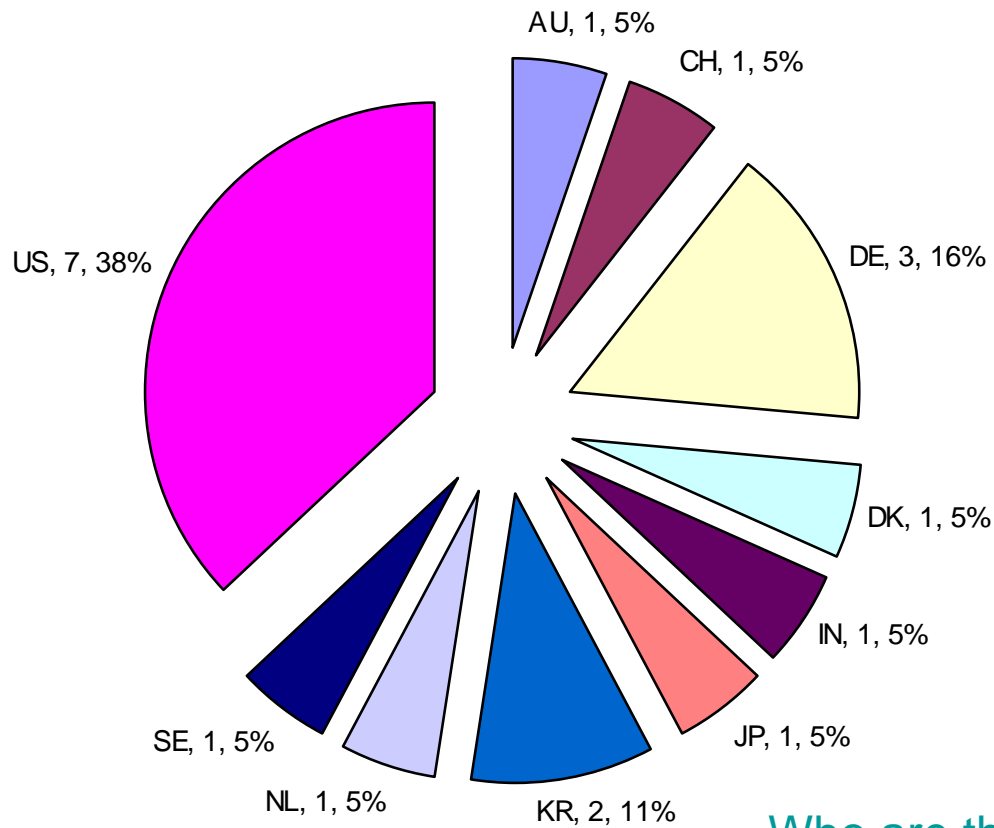

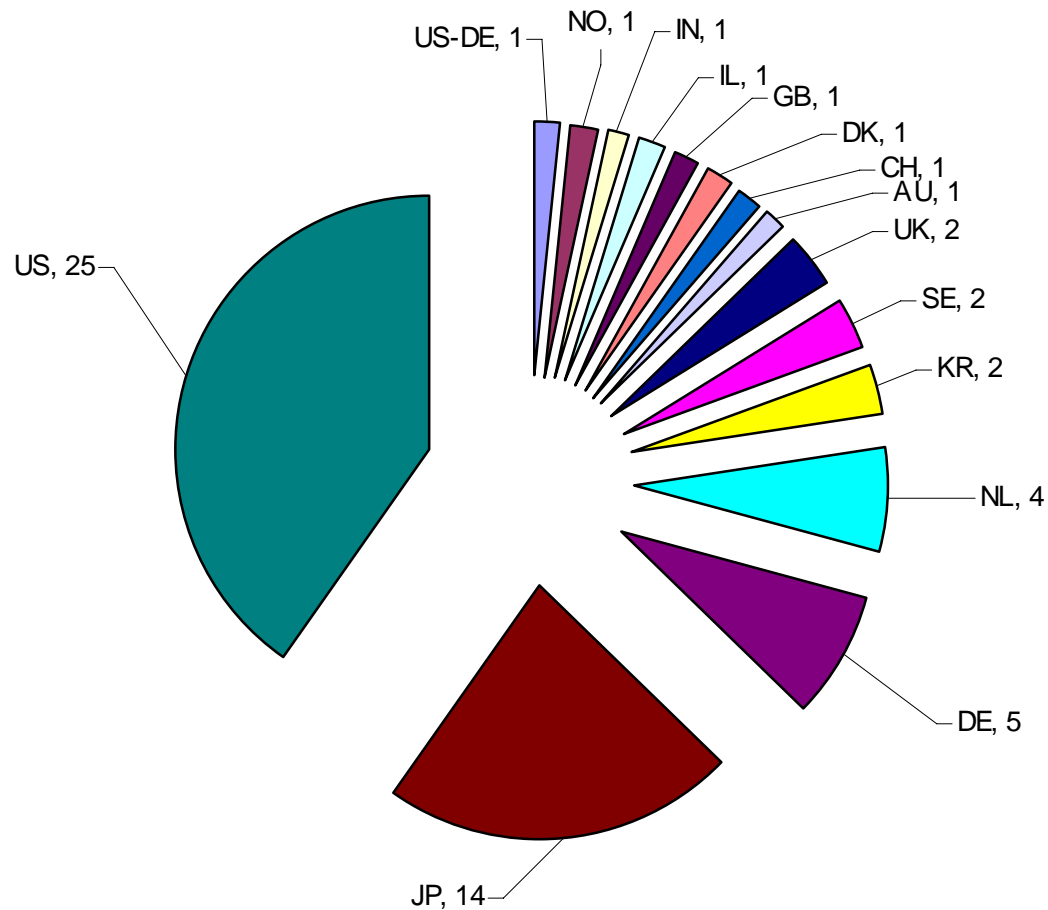
